

Cockatiels and Parakeets



Room	Animal ID # and cage number of each cockatiel (update when cockatiel come and go).
Whiteboard	Draw map of cages (showing cage #'s).
Owner	Label all owner equipment.
Equipment	List owner equipment on the Animal Care Schedule.
Housing	• Housing: Cage: Must be at least large enough for full wingspan and turning around.
	• Newspaper lining only!
	• Toys: No small enough to swallow parts or metal.
	• Cuttlebone: or mineral block may give some calcium.
	• Perches: should be wood dowels or natural branches.
	Plastic or sandpaper may cause bumblefoot.
Handling	No handling unless necessary! Always wash hands well before and after
	entering the Exotics room.
	• Use disposable gloves and change if handled.
	• *Even with clipped wings birds can fly.
	• Birds have no diaphragms. Holding them around the chest is constricting to breathing.
	• Hand raised: need special attention daily or will get sick, feather picking, mental issues.
	• **Psittacosis, a disease particular to parakeets and cockatiels that can be transferred to
	humans.
Dietary Needs	Follow owners' dietary instructions. <u>Label</u> any owner feed.
(Owner Feed)	• 80% Veg, 20% Fruit, cheese, egg.
	*Avocados are toxic!
	• Seed only diets are not recommended by vets. If they are used to a seed only diet.
	Birds will toss out fresh fruit and vegetable in favor of the high fat tasty seeds.
Water	Use a ceramic water cup bowl.
Daily	Always use disposable gloves and change between each cage.
Cleaning	• Remove poop and urine soiled litter. Add more litter as needed.
Cicuming	• Use a paper towel with water for any additional cleaning.
	No Grit in the bottom of the cage.
Health	Contact the Shelter Lead, if there is a bird with a medical issue.
Issues	• Lethargy, not eating, fluffed up, falling over. Changes or blood in droppings. Nasal or
	eye discharge. Violent feather picking.
	• Any injury or infection in the legs is very serious and must be reported immediately.
	• Document on Animal Care Schedule (and highlight it).
	• Attach cage card (Vet Needed) on clipboard and note on whiteboard.
	Veterinary staff may not be activated.
Demobilization	• Remove Animal ID # from whiteboard, once the animal is released to owner.
	• When a cage is no longer needed (Exotic has left), put cage card (Dirty) on clipboard.
	• If appropriate, take the cage / kennel to the wash station. After cleaning, spray with Rescue Solution, and let sit for 5 minutes.
	 Clean food, water bowls/bottles, and housing. Rinse well with water and return to Exotic room.
	 Put cage card (Clean) on clipboard.
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
